

Ex-Governor's Widow Dies

DENVER (AP) — Mrs. William E. Sweet, widow of the former governor of Colorado, died Saturday at her home here. She was 95.

A well known Denver social figure and club woman, Mrs. Sweet was a native of Woodbury, N.J. She graduated in 1888 from Swarthmore College, Pa., where she was a member of Phi Beta Kappa.

Mrs. Sweet was married to William E. Sweet in Philadelphia in 1892. The couple moved to Denver the same year.

Her husband, who died in 1942, was governor of Colorado from 1922-24.

Survivors include three sons, Lennig and William E. Jr., both of Denver, and Channing F. of Colorado Springs; a daughter, Mrs. Munroe Raymond of Smithville, Mo., 10 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

Private services are scheduled for Monday at her home.
