

## One Killed and Five Injured **In Weekend Plane Crashes**

One man was killed and a second seriously injured in one of two plane crashes in New Jersey yesterday. In the second one man was reported in serious condition while three others were more fortunate after the crash which enveloped their plane in flames.

In the second accident Federal Aviation Agency investigators will interview the four-man crew of a Capitol Airways jet airliner to determine why it ran off a runway and burned yesterday at an FAA airfield in Atlan-

The airliner had just touched down when it swerved off the runways and traveled about 3,500 feet over grass and taxi-ways, finally sliding to a stop Ward was a passenger in an after its landing gears sheered off.
