Wright Honored by Dayton Citizens — Houghton Calls at Palace



Dayton, O., accorded Orville Wright, co-inventor of the first man-carrying airplane, its highest honors Tuesday. A reception in his honor was attended by townsmen, many of whom knew the Wright brothers as boys, and 100 foreign delegates to the celebration.
