

Start Home Mail Delivery Monday In Wenonah Area

**Two Carriers Named
As New Service Is
Inaugurated in Borough**

The postman had good news today for the residents of Wenonah—delivery of mail to homes in the borough will be inaugurated Monday morning.

The action follows many months of planning by the post office department to abandon the former "box system" in the growing residential area, for "the betterment of postal service," Postmaster George Baldwin said. "It had been suffering under the former system," he added.

The two new carriers will start out on their routes at 8:30 A. M. Monday, Baldwin announced. They are John Hindman, Jr., 32, of 201 S. Clinton Ave., Wenonah, and Earle Payton, 33, of the nearby Hammond Heights development in Deptford Township.

In addition to the Borough of Wenonah, the delivery service will include homes in Hammond Heights, Deptford Terrace and the area known as East Wenonah, the postmaster announced.

Serve 650 Homes

A total of 650 homes are included in the new routes. Included are 430 in Wenonah, 120 in Hammond Heights, and 50 in the Deptford Terrace-East Wenonah section.

The post office, located at 6 North West Ave., will retain about 250 of the 500 boxes for use of business firms and salesmen, Baldwin said.

The community's senior citizens recall that the borough has had the "pick-up-your-own-mail" system since prior to 1909, Baldwin declared.

Homes Numbered

He said the plans leading to the delivery were put in motion by notifying residents through notices in the Woodbury Times that a survey was being conducted. Residents were advised to contact Tax Collector James T. Shuster for their correct house numbers, which were established by the postal survey, and in less than three weeks the project was completed, Baldwin said.
